EJOL Background

- A child of a project on promoting open access publishing to Ethiopian journals.
- A collaborative Project of Addis Ababa University Libraries and Electronic Information for Libraries (EIFL)
- Call for proposals for open access advocacy campaigns was announced to EIFL partner countries to reach out to research communities in 2013.
- Addis Ababa University Libraries was one of the winners of EIFL OA advocacy call for proposals(2013)
- EJOL Platform has been implemented using OJS in September 2013.
- a workshop on open access publishing Conducted in October 2013.
- A training on using EJOL has been conducted November, 2013.
- EJOL was launched in March 2014 with six Journals
- Upgraded to the latest OJS 3 in 2017

post-graduate students and researchers, librarians, research managers and national policy makers, editors of STM journals. Expected results of this conference are to improve the awareness of OA and to clarify some misunderstanding of OA; to promote OA practices and to encourage more OA projects.

Project title: Encouragement and Practice of OA among Academics

Summary: The goal of the project is to raise researchers', funders' and publishers' awareness of OA. Since 2012 the Estonian Research Council requires making research articles, produced from publicly funded research, available for everyone. Nevertheless, a clear national OA policy has not been developed yet. Raising discussions on the importance of having a national OA policy is one of the main project aims. The second aim is to raise awareness on open research data and to launch an open research data collection at UT OA institutional repository. An international conference on OA to research results and open data will be organized during OA Week to discuss how universities and research funders should require OA to publicly funded research results/data. It will be followed by the Open Data Months (October-November) when researchers will be encouraged to share their research data. UT Library will also organize a seminar on OA practices. The Estonian Ministry of Education and Research is one of the project partners.

Project title: Promoting OA publishing to Ethiopian journals

Summary: The project objective is to improve the visibility of accessibility of Ethiopian journals by promoting OA publishing and implementing Open Journal Systems (OJS) – a FOSS journal management and publishing system, developed by the Public Knowledge Project. A series of meeting, workshop and training will be conducted with researchers and students, research administrators and policy makers, as well as university presses and society publishers so that to improve their awareness on OA publishing and skill on OJS. It is expected that at the end of the project more journals will use OJS and will be published in OA which in turn will improve the visibility and the accessibility of the journals internationally.

Project title: Advancing faculty-driven OA policies and practices among academic faculties in Lesotho

Summary: The aim of the project is to involve lecturers, students and librarians to formulate, adopt and implement faculty-based OA policies at the National University of Lesotho and Lesotho College of Education. Advocacy strategy includes setting up an OA advocacy committee, organizing a workshop and other training and promotional events, assisting three academic journals to be published in OA; forging cooperation between active student groups and librarians; awarding the researchers, lectures and students with the most deposits in the OA repository.
